2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR

All New Vistas students need to register every year.Registration for new students will begin on Tuesday, February 4th. Registration will then be ongoing on a first come, first served basis until classes are full and waiting lists are established. EARLY ADMISSION TESTING

- If your child is not 5 years old by September 1, 2020, & you are interested in early enrollment for Kindergarten for the 2020-21 school year, you will need to make an appointment for early admission testing.
- Students must turn 5 before December 31, 2020, to be tested for early admission to K.
- New Vistas does not encourage families to pursue early Kindergarten enrollment unless test results indicate a high level of academic achievement and maturity.
- The Early Admission to K testing is by appointment only and will begin January 15, 2020.
- Please pick up a "Request for Early Admission Form" from your child's current Preschool / Pre K teacher, fill it out, & then return it to your child's teacher for her to complete.

YEARBOOK

Memory Book will again be the publisher of our 2019-20 New Vistas' Yearbook. It will feature individual pictures of all students, teachers and aides, as well as a collage page for each class.

Every student will receive a yearbook at the end of the school year, which is included in your activity fee.






YOUR BRAIN: THE OWNER'S MANUAL

The Food Bank also provides items such as deodorant, disposable diapers, toothpaste and toilet paper to those in need if you would like to donate any of those.
